

Statements removed due to lack of Consensus

In a community setting, a Stroke survivor may not receive 45 minutes of therapy due to social issues (such as lack of social support, addiction or social complexity)
If a stroke survivor was fully dependent on care before they had a stroke, they are less likely to continue to receive 45 minutes of therapy daily
A stroke survivor may not receive 45 minutes of therapy if they are not ready for therapy (e.g. not dressed, eating a meal, in the toilet, receiving medication, receiving artificial feeding)
Stroke survivors receiving ESD support are unlikely to receive more than one therapy session per day at home (i.e. only one visit per-day from the ESD service)
In an inpatient setting, it is difficult to return to a stroke survivor for a second time in a day, if they are unable to tolerate 45 minutes of therapy in one session
My ability to provide 45 minutes of therapy can be limited by inadequate therapy space and/or equipment
